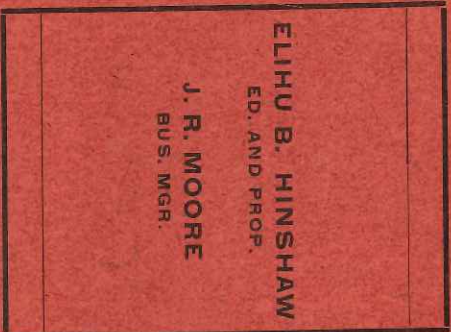

The Avenues running north and south and west of Katy Ry tracks are numbered from First av up and in most cases streets running north and south and east of Katy Ry tracks are numbered from First on up.
